

Summer beers should be crisp and on the lighter side; leave the heavy stuff out. Save it for the colder seasons. Kolsh and Pilsner styles come to mind, as well as lighter lagers. IPA's now offer a wide range of flavors that include citrus and floral notes instead of languishing in bitterness as they have in years past, so don't be afraid to try out the new offerings on shelves. They're especially good with a savory steak or burger! American Amber Ale, which was the brew of choice for our brewing contest with the Cerveseros this year, is a great choice as well. Local breweries offer commercial versions of all these styles, and your Brews Brothers may have some as well, so don't hesitate to ask! Many breweries have also begun adding flavors to their beers in their seasonal offerings, opening beer up to a wider range of palates. Grapefruit, lemon, peanut butter and jelly, even pickle and jalapeño flavors can be seen on the shelves these days. Though many beer fans & purists turn up their noses at those "beers" (flavoring beer violates the beer purity law, the Reinheitsgebot, which deserves a google), let us not complain about anything cold, bubbly, and alcoholic! 
Alzafar Golf Unit





then it gets passed down the line. Turn right and repeat. We got through it and in the future a better plan will occur.






